

Clinical Policy: New Technologies and New Uses of Existing Technologies

### **Description**

This policy describes the process for evaluating the medical necessity of new technologies and new uses of existing technologies, including medical procedures or new uses of existing medical procedures for ocular care, new pharmaceuticals or new uses of existing pharmaceuticals for ocular procedure related use, and new devices or new uses of existing devices for ocular conditions.

### Policy/Criteria

- I. It is the policy of health plans affiliated with Centene Corporation® (Centene) and Envolve Vision, Inc.® (Envolve) that the use of new technologies and new uses of existing technologies are **medically necessary** and evaluated for inclusion in benefits for the following indications:
  - A. When the technology or use improves health outcomes, health risks and health benefits compared with established procedures and products, as proven through the following sources:
    - 1. The approval of evidence-based safety and efficacy studies from appropriate government regulatory bodies, including the Food and Drug Administration (FDA) and Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services (CMS).
    - 2. Clinical preferred practice pattern publications, including those from the American Academy of Ophthalmology and American Optometric Association.
    - 3. Input from relevant specialists and professionals who have expertise in the new technology or new use of existing technology.
    - 4. Published clinical literature and scientific evidence, including current medical journals, published clinical research, or other evidence-based medicine resources.

#### **Background**

New technologies or new applications of existing technologies include services or supplies which include, but are not limited to any diagnosis, treatment, procedure, facility, equipment, drugs, drug usage, devices, or supplies. When clinical literature and safety and efficacy studies support adoption of a new technology or new indications for use of an existing technology; clinical criteria will be reviewed and adopted into relevant clinical policies for continued use. See OC.UM.0006 Clinical Criteria for UM Decisions.
